To qualify, please come in to the PAW Team office Tuesday through Thursday between 10:00 am and 3:00 pm. Please bring a photo ID and proof of any income, including public assistance such as Social Security. If you have no income but have a recent bank statement, please bring that. If you have no income and no bank statement, all you need is your photo ID.

## **PET FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS**

### **CHOW: Pet Food Assistance**

Those who are on government assistance of any kind are qualified to receive pet food assistance through the Humane Society for Southwest Washington's CHOW program. Families receive one month's supply of food, per household, per month. Animals are required to be spayed or neutered, and owners must agree to not acquire new pets while using the program. Proof of government assistance as well as spay and neuter paperwork are required to qualify.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

### **DoveLewis Velvet Assistance Fund**

DoveLewis can treat animals from low-income families and stray, wild and abused animals. Qualifications are as follows:

- Cases must be emergencies.
- A DoveLewis veterinarian must examine the patient and confirm without diagnostic testing that the animal has a good prognosis without fatal injuries or unrecoverable symptoms.
- Common examples of conditions that are covered by the Velvet Assistance Fund are:
  - Eye ulcers
  - Lacerations
  - Abscesses
- You must state a financial need.
- You must apply for CareCredit first, a financing company offered to people who don't have a credit card available to them. If you are approved, the full limit must be used before additional financial aid is applied.
- If your CareCredit limit is exhausted or you are declined CareCredit coverage, up to \$750 from the Velvet Assistance Fund will be applied to your pet's balance.
- You can qualify once per year.
