Things are hopping (averaging about eight bunnies a week staying in the shelter these days) at your Humane Society. We're working with the Points of Light Foundation on a project to enhance our volunteer program (we're 1,100 strong) – strengthening volunteer and staff interactions and building more effective teams that care for the 8,000+ animals we care for each year.

We have also created a disaster preparedness plan to ensure that whether we can stay onsite or be forced to leave our building, the cats and

dogs and puppies and kittens and rabbits will be safe, have shelter, food and water, access to veterinary care and quality enrichment opportunities in case of disaster. And, that we can accommodate onsite staff needs 24 hours a day.

If that's not enough, we launched a year-long Population Management Initiative in early winter, examining all our processes and procedures to identify opportunities to improve efficiency and effectiveness from the moment an animal arrives at our door through adoption and on to their new families. We're learning a lot and have some great ideas for streamlining our operations.

We continue to adopt animals into families at the highest numbers in our history. And, to meet that demand, we transport animals that are at high risk of euthanasia from overcrowded shelters throughout United States. At the same time, a growing number of strays arrive at our doors with significantly more challenging health and behavioral problems. So, we are beginning to shift some of our focus toward helping families keep their animals at home.

We are expanding our behavioral team to work with special needs dogs, as well as providing greater post-adoption support. We are creating new training and coaching programs for pet owners in general. And, for cats and their owners, too. We are also expanding current partnerships and developing new ones with veterinary practices to ensure that our animals have access to specialty care, and that low-income families have access to basic wellness care. Watch for more to come in these areas.

"Summertime and the livin' is easy" may be a theme for many this year. For HSSW, "the livin' is busy....very, very busy." Come visit us and we'll show you around and share with you the work we're doing to ensure a bright and happy future for People + Dogs + Cats.


# A CHRISTMAS Tail Only 125 Days til Christmas

Peanut had a long journey ahead of him when he first arrived at HSSW. After being hit by a car, he had to have his left-front leg amputated. But his medical adventures didn't stop there...the HSSW veterinarians discovered his right-front leg was also fractured and would require a complicated surgical procedure. Thanks to our wonderful partners at VCA Northwest Veterinary Specialists who performed the surgery and monitored Peanut during the first critical days to make sure his repair held.

Once he was back on his feet, Peanut received tenderloving (and splash-filled) care at Willows Waters. Hydrotherapy allowed him to strengthen his muscles and rehabilitate after the surgery.

Peanut's surgery and recovery wouldn't have been possible without financial support from the Chasin' For Chopper Fund. Started by Tina and Matt Olson, in honor of their shelter dog Chopper, this community fund provides assistance to HSSW dogs in need of life-saving medical and surgical procedures.

It definitely takes a village. And thanks to the very special village of HSSW donors, partners, staff, volunteers and foster parents, Peanut is now enjoying a happy and loving new life in his new family.
