Safe Haven provides emergency boarding assistance for families of Clark and Cowlitz counties. The program provides temporary shelter for the pets of families facing temporary hardship or displacement due to interpersonal violence, housing insecurity, hospitalization, or inpatient treatment. Please note, all pets accepted into the program will be spayed or neutered, vaccinated, and microchipped at no additional cost.

Dogs on Deployment - Hero Pet Boarding Network (HPBN)

The Hero Pet Boarding Network (HPBN) is Dogs on Deployment's flagship program, dedicated to helping military pet owners by connecting them with volunteer boarders, known as DoD Boarders. These compassionate volunteers offer free, temporary pet care while military members are deployed, in training, or facing service-related challenges. This program ensures that pets remain safe and loved, giving military families peace of mind during their time of service.

Home to Home (Fostering)

A free foster website for pet owners who need to find a temporary home for their pets including dogs, cats, and other animals. Pets can go from one home right into another without having to come to the shelter, which means less stress for animals and humans alike!

SPOT (Supporting Pet Owners in Transition)

The SPOT program uses Seattle Humane's existing foster network to house pets for owners who need temporary care due to housing insecurity, hospitalization or another personal crisis. This program is designed to support pet owners who may be facing the decision to surrender their animal to a shelter. Rather than having to part with their pet, Seattle Humane's animal care team and foster families step in to provide care for up to 90 days. The goal is to reunite pets with their owners, offering them both a second chance to stay together.
